FEI Forest School Scotland – update on the qualification

Penny Martin is coordinating a Working group comprising FS Scotland training providers on this. A meeting with Forest School Scotland training providers took place on 20/1/14, with the aim to find consensus on Forest School Scotland course content for credit rating on the Scottish Credit and Qualification Framework (SCQF). As providers are affiliated to different Awarding Bodies, no decision was made on which option to take, but participants agreed to review the course content wording to make a better fit for Scotland. Mapping Forest School across Scotland

With the support of the GIS team at Forestry Commission Scotland, Penny has produced a map which reflects the information you have provided for the Forest School database. This gives an indication of where Forest School practitioners (and trainees) are, across Scotland. The more people registered on this database, the more accurate this picture will be!

Forest School Scotland Case Studies

In Aberdeenshire, teacher and Forest School practitioner John West Hughes runs woodland sessions outdoors for the pupils at Drumoak School.

On delivering the curriculum outdoors, John says "last session I took each class in Drumoak to the forest for 6 sessions along with 2 parent helpers. We have 4 composite classes so I tied the learning up with their topics - P1/2 living things P3/4 enterprise P5/6 Energy P6/7 Rainforest. Each class also made a floor book to show their learning, the curricular areas we covered and what photographs from the sessions. This session each class will have 2 days in the wood, and the reason behind the taster sessions for parents and teachers is to encourage others to lead FS activities in Drumoak School while simultaneously promoting outdoor learning."

Do you want to find out more? John has been running Forest School taster sessions for any teachers or parents. The final one is on Saturday 8th March at Drumoak School. These Saturday morning sessions run 930 – 1130 and involve half hour presentation/practical then into the forest. Anyone interested please contact [John West Hughes](#)

OTHER NEWS

Grounds for Learning film resource

This resource is for anyone who has an interest in children's wellbeing at school, although it has been designed to be particularly relevant to support staff. It explores how outdoor play in schools supports children's learning and development, identifies a range of ideas for enriching play and shares practical advice from schools that have developed good play practice.

New Standards for Scotland's teachers

Launched August 2013 by the GTCS, the new [Professional Standards for Teachers](#) have big implications for teachers and the development of outdoor learning in Scotland. The Standards cover Registration, Career-Long Professional Learning, Leadership and Management. Within this suite of Professional Standards there are a number of key themes:

- Professional Values and Personal Commitment
- Learning for Sustainability
- Leadership

Teachers are now required to "understand and develop the most appropriate contexts for learning including outdoor learning and be able to apply appropriate pedagogies for these environments".

Big Announces New £30 Million Environment Fund (UK)

The Big Lottery Fund announced a new funding programme, Our Environment Our Future. This UK-wide £30 million investment is set to support projects enabling young people (aged 11-24) to improve their local environment and increase their employability through learning new skills. The deadline is the 16 May 2014 for organisations to apply for the role of UK-wide strategic partner.

The People's Trust for Endangered Species is inviting research project applications from voluntary conservation organisations, scientific researchers, individuals and consortia under its UK Mammals Grant Scheme. The deadline for applications is the 13th October 2014.

Funding for Summer Playschemes (UK)

The Hilden Charitable Fund has announced that its Summer Playscheme Grants Programme is now open for applications.

The aim of the scheme is to help community groups run Summer Playschemes for the benefit of children from refugee and ethnic minority families. Funding of between £500 and £1,500 is available for Summer Playschemes for children aged 5 - 18 years lasting for 2 - 6 weeks with strong volunteer support. The funding is available to voluntary agencies with an income of less than £120,000. Some priority will be given to projects which show they are inclusive of children from refugee families, and show BME involvement.

The closing date for applications is the 15th March 2014.

Start and Grow (Scotland)

The Foundation Scotland has announced that next deadline for applications to "Start and Grow" is the 30th April 2014.

Start & Grow is the first investment package offered by Resilient. Start & Grow is primarily a loan package with an element of grant funding, to support the development and growth of both new and existing social and environmental organisations in 13 local authorities (Clackmannanshire, Dundee City, East Ayrshire, City of Edinburgh, Fife, Glasgow City, Inverclyde, North Lanarkshire, North Ayrshire, Renfrewshire, South Lanarkshire, West Dunbartonshire, and West Lothian). Organisations can apply for investment packages

ranging from £10,000 to £60,000 and the funds can be used to finance revenue or capital costs, including first asset purchases, wages, refurbishment, set up and running costs.

Community Food Fund (Scotland)

Scotland's Rural College has announced that the third round of the Community Food Fund is open for applications.

The Fund aims to promote local food and drink through supporting activities that focus on three main outcomes. These are:

- Creating or enhancing a current food and drink network / group / community
- Supporting development of food trails and networks
- Establishing local food and drink events, including farmers' markets that celebrate and promote food and drink throughout the year.

The scheme is open to food and drink producer groups, networks and community organisations. It is not open to individual businesses. Applicants can apply for up to £25,000. The deadline application for this round of the Fund is 5pm on Thursday 20th March 2014.

Trees for Communities (UK)

The Tree Council, the lead tree campaigning charity working to promote the importance of trees within the changing environment, has announced that its Trees for Communities grant making programme is now open for applications.

Funds are available for community groups within the UK who are able to show that children under the age of 16 will be actively engaged in tree planting projects during National Tree Week 2013 (29th November to 1st December 2014). The Tree Council can fund projects between £100 and £700 and successful applicants will receive up to 75% towards their planting costs. For example, if your project totals £700, The Tree Council would offer up to £525. The remaining 25% will need to be secured by your school or organisation.

The closing date for applications is the 31st March 2014.

Trees for Schools (UK)

The Tree Council, the lead tree campaigning charity working to promote the importance of trees within the changing environment, has announced that its Trees for Schools grant making programme is now open for applications.

Funds are available for schools within the UK who are able to show that children under the age of 16 will be actively engaged in tree planting projects during National Tree Week 2013 (29th November to 1st December 2014). Schools must be local authority run or registered as a 'not for profit' organisation (including a community interest company, a charity organisation or a social enterprise). The Tree Council can fund projects between £100 and £700 and successful applicants will receive up to 75% towards their planting costs. For example, if your project totals £700, The Tree Council would offer up to £525. The remaining 25% will need to be secured by your school or organisation.

The closing date for applications is the 31st March 2014.

Funding for Schools Science Projects (UK)

The Royal Society has announced that its Partnership Grant scheme has re-opened for applications. Through the scheme grants of up to £3,000 are available to support teachers, scientists and engineers help develop science projects. The aim is to make the teaching of science more interesting within primary and secondary schools. The Partnership grants scheme forms partnerships to allow teachers to increase their scientific knowledge and to give scientists and engineers the chance to develop their communication skills and engage with enquiring young minds. Any UK primary or secondary school teacher or practicing

scientist/engineer can apply as long as the students involved in the project are between 5 and 18.

The closing date for applications will be the 28th February 2014.

People's Postcode Trust Small Grants Programme (Scotland, Wales and North of England)

The People's Postcode Trust has announced that its small grants programme has re-opened for applications.

Through its small grants programme, the People's Postcode Trust offers grants of between £500 and £20,000 to small organisations and community groups for projects lasting up to 6 months in the areas of:

- Poverty Prevention
- Advancement of Health
- Community Development
- Public Sports
- Human Rights
- Environmental Protection.

Eligible regions for this funding round will be Scotland, Wales and the North of England.

The closing date for applications for this funding round is the 21st February 2014.

Climate Challenge Fund (Scotland)

Keep Scotland Beautiful, has announced that the next deadline for draft applications to the Climate challenge fund (for funding of £30,000 and over) is the 4th April 2014.

Through the Climate Challenge Fund, Communities across Scotland can apply for grants of up to £150,000 per year to help reduce their carbon footprint and become more energy efficient. Nearly £30 million in total will be awarded to communities who come forward with innovative ideas to tackle their carbon emissions.

For applications of below £30,000 there is a monthly decision making process.

Microbiology in Schools Fund (UK)

The Society for General Microbiology has announced that its Microbiology in Schools Fund is now open for applications.

Through the fund, grants of up to £1,000 are available to schools or individuals that are members of the Society to support microbiology teaching initiatives and events. Grants can be used to support a range of microbiology-related projects.

Applicants can submit more than one application during the year, but no more than a total of £1,000 will be awarded to a single individual / school during a single calendar year.

Applications can be submitted at any time until the budget has been exhausted.

Quaker Housing Trust Grant (UK)

The Quaker Housing Trust has announced that the next deadline for applications is the 7th March 2014.

The Quaker Housing Trust provides grants and interest free loans to housing projects that cater for people with mental and physical health problems, social disadvantage and abuse, etc.. This can include:

- Converting, renovating or refurbishing property; building new housing, buying property and/or land
- Expanding an existing housing project
- Making a housing project 'greener'; etc.

To be eligible for funding, applicants need to have legal charitable status and be a small organisation (with an annual turnover of not more than £5 million).
